2. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In late 2022 I was asked to consider rejoining the Water Polo South Australia Board (WPSA). As was the case for several sporting organisations WPSA faced some challenges. These challenges were not dissimilar to when I first became President for WPSA some years ago. In December 2022 I was appointed to the WPSA Board and elected President. That resulted in a Board comprising of 3 new Board members and pleasingly 4 continuing Directors.

The new Board started the process of assessing the state of the WPSA affairs. During the busy December period The Board identified the critical areas that needing priority attention. This initial assessment showed that WPSA needed to :-

- Review our available operational resources.
- Assess our financial position as our FY22 finances had not been audited.
- Improve the operational information reported to the WPSA Board.
- Restore reporting to members given there have been no Annual reports for 4 years.
- Restore the confidence of Water Polo Australia (WPA) in our organisation.
- Most importantly, improve our primary product to our members the local competition.

What gave me confidence of success was the calm, collegiate and committed manner of the Board members in working through the process of change. WPSA stakeholders were consulted as the Board went about developing a basic strategy to set the direction and improve the WPSA organisation.

As you would expect, there were a great deal of opinions on what action is needed for improvement. From my previous experience with WPSA, we need to focus on the key issues and reduce the occurrence of problems or those issues that consume significant time for little benefit.

The headline of this strategy was that WPSA could not expect meaningful change with our current level staff and financial resources. At a minimum, a full time General Manager and a part time Competitions Officer is required. The Strategy also identified other areas of improvement but also some great opportunities to build upon our strengths.

After a period of consultation, the WPSA Board was pleased to appoint Eddie Denis as the General Manager for WPSA. The appointment is a significant milestone and an inflection point for WPSA and positively supported by WPA. Although a very recent appointment and technically outside the reporting period of this document, we have already seen a significant change of how WPSA conducts business.

An unexpected activity for WPSA through 2023 was the redevelopment of the Adelaide Aquatic Centre (AAC). This project came in a rush of phone calls one Saturday morning just before the Premier made the announcement. Fortunately, WPSA has very good relationships with the Office of Rec and Sport, the local Minister, the Minister responsible for the project and even the Premier to a lesser extent. WPSA importantly developed a positive relationship with the project team and our collective work will deliver a very good facility for WPSA activities. We are also starting to address the challenge of the closure period. A lot of time and effort has gone into the AAC project and thank you to Eddie Denis and Jon Harmer for their assistance.

Summing up this year's highlights and challenges for the WPSA Board: -

- Assessment of WPSA operating affairs
- Development of a high-level strategy
- Re-establishment of a positive relationship with Water Polo Australia including the shared services concept.
- Strengthening of our relationship with SAALC.
- The first WPSA awards night for several years.
- Return of an Annual Reports. The last being FY2019.
- End of season player survey for input into the coming summer season
- An albeit brief winter season in 2023 after not having one last year.
- The positive outcome with SA Government for the AAC re-development.
- The establishment of the first full time General Manager position for WPSA and the appointment of Eddie Denis to this role.

Earlier in this report I mentioned 2023 has been an inflection point for WPSA. While this may be the case, the reality is our journey transforming Water Polo in South Australia to a growth and successful sport will take several years. To achieve this outcome, we will need to grow our resources and in particular our available funds.

The last 15 years or so have been tough for WPSA while other states have developed a stronger offering in their sport. Quite simply, WPSA needs greater participation in our sport over a long period of time. This will assist WPSA to return to a competitive level in National Competitions and `deliver a more professional local competition.

While 2023 has been a difficult year, we have made positive progress. I believe we have the right Board and Staff to increase the awareness and participation in Water Polo in the coming years. In the short term we will be able to improve our operations and services to the clubs and members.

In closing, I would like to thank and congratulate the WPSA Board, our staff members Eddie Denis and Anna Porcaro for our progress this year. I will also note that In February 2023 one of the continuing Board members Michelle Barnes resigned due to other commitments but offered her services for specific matters. Michelle's contribution and ongoing support are acknowledged and greatly appreciated. We would also like to acknowledge and thank Chris Luz-Raymond's contributions as Executive Officer from June 2020 to June 2023.

I keenly feel the responsibility of this role in facilitating a higher quality of product in every sense and in developing ideas that make Water Polo more visible as a sport and more sustainable as a business.

Growth is usually a slow and deliberate process. The concept of the Flywheel gaining momentum is what I am aiming to achieve. Growth will take the combined effort of many people, many times, in many different roles within our Water Polo community. The momentum we build will bring excitement into our sport and will help motivate us all to keep the momentum going.

My vision for Water Polo in South Australia is that it is a highly regarded and well-known aquatic sport which is growing year on year.

My aims are to:

- Improve our office efficiency through better planning, communication, engagement, and governance.
- Improve the quality of our local competition and provide improved support and education for our volunteers and officials.
- Improve what we do for our State squads and teams so that our performance at National competitions improves over time.
- Present our sport as an exciting aquatic sport option for children.
- Be more visible to more people more often.



Notes to the Financial Statements

Water Polo South Australia

For the year ended 30 June 2023

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act SA 1985*. The Board Members has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs. This financial report does not comply with any Australian Accounting Standards unless stated otherwise.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Board Members reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under subsection 5-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Grant income is recognised when the Association obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the Association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.




